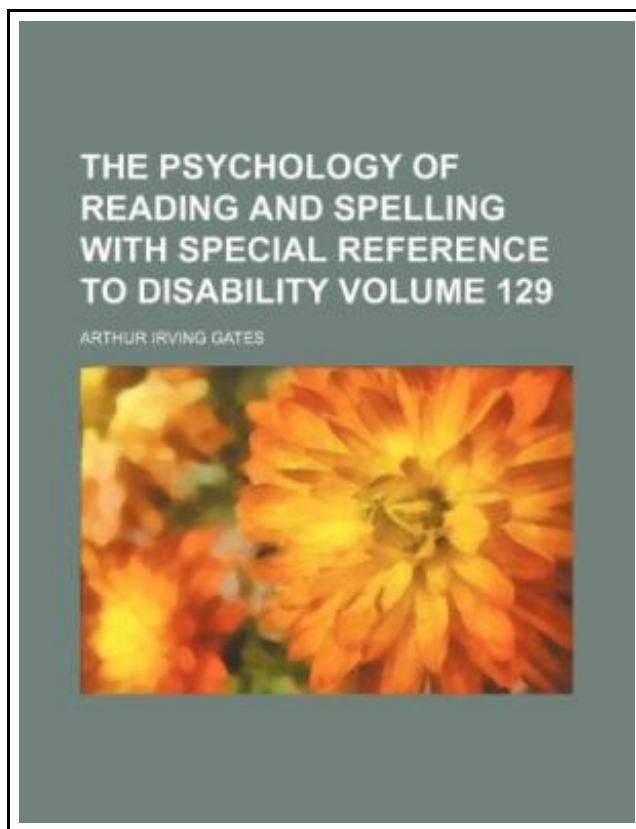

N 40 Pupils Of Grades VII And VIII The correlation between the two visual vocabulary tests (0. 82) is the same as that found in the lower grades (See Table XIX). The correlations between the visual vocabulary tests and reading are lower in the upper grades; about 0. 54 as compared to 0. 65 for the Burgess, and 0. 46 as compared to 0. 68 for the Thorndike-McCall. Correlations of vocabulary tests with spelling are slightly less than 0. 5 for both groups. Correlations of the vocabulary tests with spelling, ability to detect small differences between pairs of words, and proof-reading, are also included in Table XX to show the substantial correlations that obtain between this wide variety of abilities in dealing with verbal material. 5. Summary The main conclusions from this section are: 1. The Thorndike-McCall Reading Scale measures power of comprehension relatively freed of the mechanical factors involved in reading.
